Our classes are open to performers of any age – we would welcome adults and children alike, as soloists, groups or ensembles.

Music Festival:

In Music we have classes for vocal and all instruments for soloists or ensembles.

Speech and Drama:

There is poetry, memorised prose and prepared reading, acting, devising and mime for soloists and groups.

Trophies:

If you won a returnable trophy in the 2023 festival, would you please return it to your teacher by 25 March 2024 so that we can have them ready to award for 2024. Medals and non-returnable trophies do not have to be returned.

HOW TO ENTER THE FESTIVAL

PLEASE READ THE FOLLOWING CAREFULLY BEFORE MAKING YOUR ENTRY

You can perform in any music class using either pre-recorded backing tracks or live accompaniment, such as a pianist. This is your choice.

PLEASE ENTER WITHIN YOUR GRADE BAND

For instance, if you are Grade 5 piano entrant then you should enter Intermediate grade classes and play a piece of that level (ie a grade 5 piece, not a grade 4 piece). This rule applies to all piano and instrumental classes.

LIVE ACCOMPANIMENT

We do not provide an official festival accompanist.

You may bring your own accompanist, but if you don't have one then please contact us if you have any difficulty.

If you engage an accompanist, you must expect to pay for their services, and this is your responsibility and not that of the festival.

We advise that you engage an accompanist as soon as you have entered the festival as they get busy, and you might also like to have a rehearsal before your performance.

ELECTRONIC ACCOMPANIMENT (backing tracks)

If you choose to use pre-recorded backing tracks for your performance(s) please bring the tracks on a device (ie on a CD or USB stick).

All vocal performances will be unmiked.

IMPORTANT NOTE:

It is important that your backing track is 'burnt' onto a CD or transferred onto a correctly formatted USB in order for your track to be played successfully. Dragging the song file(s) across to a CD or USB will not effectively burn them to the device or CD nor allow the sound system to play your track, and we cannot guarantee Bluetooth connectivity during the Festival. We appreciate your support in this matter.

Time limits must be adhered to – please make yourself aware of our rules.

MUSIC ADJUDICATOR EILEEN FIELD ARAM, GRSM, LRAM, ARCM, PGCA



Eileen Field studied singing and piano at the Royal Academy of Music and has since had extensive experience as a soprano soloist, piano accompanist and choral conductor.

Eileen is a grade and diploma examiner for the Associated Board of the Royal Schools of Music, also moderating examiners and helping to train new examiners. In 2007 she was appointed Consultant

Moderator, and she is the Lead Consultant in the selection of repertoire for the ABRSM Singing Syllabus. She has examined and presented seminars for teachers in the UK, Southern Africa, the Far East, Bermuda and the USA, and throughout Europe, including Scandinavia, the Faroe Islands, Iceland, Turkey and Poland.

Eileen maintains a substantial private teaching practice for adults and children from beginners to post-graduate level in London and gives masterclasses for solo singers and choirs, working with among others, students at the Reykjavík Academy of Singing and Vocal Arts in Iceland. Her work as a long-established adjudicator for the British and International Federation of Festivals takes her all over the British Isles and Ireland.

She was appointed an Associate of the Royal Academy of Music in 1998.

FESTIVAL RULES OF ENTRY

ENTRIES

- 1. All entries must be made either online via the website entry portal or using the official entry form by email to contact@northamptonfestival.co.uk, or by post and submitted as a paper entry reaching the Entries Secretary on or before the closing date as given in the syllabus.
- 2. Late entries will not be accepted.
- 3. Entry fees will only be returned as a decision of the committee.
- 4. The committee reserves the right to refuse any entry.
- 5. Each entrant must be in the appropriate school year group for each class. Group entries must belong to the specified year groupings. Class is determined by how old the pupil is on 31 August 2023.
- 6. Performers in all ensemble classes must be bona fide members of the group concerned.
- 7. Entrants may perform only once in each class except in duet, trio or ensemble classes where an entrant may perform more than once provided a different part is played.

GENERAL

- 8. The festival is for amateurs, which is defined as one who does not receive more than out-of-pocket expenses for services rendered in those branches of the arts with which the festival is concerned. This rule does not apply to a conductor.
- 9. The committee reserves the right to limit, cancel or subdivide any class.
- 10. The committee reserves the right to substitute any adjudicator without notice.
- 11. No photographs or recordings may be taken during any performance but may be taken after the performance with relevant permission.
- 12. The festival committee cannot accept responsibility for property left at the venues during the festival
- 13. Class timings will be emailed to the entrant, parent or teacher who made the entry.

OWN CHOICE PIECES

- 13. A copy of Own Choice pieces (including choices from examination grades) must be provided for the adjudicator's use on the day and be marked with name and class number.
- 14. The festival does not provide an official accompanist. Electronic accompaniment (backing track) is permitted and must be provided on CD or via Bluetooth.
- 15. Time Limits apply to actual performance time, which does not include tuning time, setting of the stage or introduction. Time Limits will be strictly adhered to and if exceeded the performance may not be placed.

ASSESSMENT & AWARDS

- 16. Whilst performance in some classes has a competitive element, it is not an examination, and the intention is to offer a performance opportunity in a supportive environment.
- 17. A category system as recommended by the British and International Federation of Festivals is used as a method of assessment:

The British and International Federation of Festivals are recommending use of a new Marking Scheme which our Adjudicators will be using at our Festival this year.

The proposed categories are:

- 95+ Exceptional
- 90 94 Outstanding
- 85 89 Distinction
- 80 84 Commended
- 75 79 Merit
- 78 74 Progressing
- 65 69 Developing

Using positive and affirming language, the individual descriptors for each of the speech and drama and music categories will be published in our festival programme.

- 18. No entrant, teacher or interested party may discuss any aspect of the festival with an Adjudicator before, during or after classes, except at the invitation of the Adjudicator.
- 19. Every entrant will receive a performance certificate and the adjudicator's comments. After adjudication, certificates and awards will be presented. Awards may be withheld if, in the opinion of the adjudicator, sufficient merit is not shown.
- 20. Trophies remain the property of the Northampton Festival and should be returned to the Trophies Secretary one month prior to the next festival.

COPYRIGHT

- 21. It is the entrant's responsibility to ensure that the provisions of the 1956 and 1988 copyright acts are observed. The music publishers' association has revised its code of practice insofar as own choice works selected from volumes is concerned: when selecting from a publication containing several different works and where the required work is not published separately, one copy may be made for the adjudicator. The copy will be retained by the festival and destroyed after the event. This permission does not apply to set works nor to making copies for accompanists who must always be given an original copy from which to play. Single copies of items may not be photocopied without the prior permission of the copyright holder. - 22. Our Speech and Drama section is pleased to announce that it has entered into an agreement with the Authors' Licensing and Collecting Society. This means that performers do not have to seek Copyright permission for any poetry, prose or solo dramatic items performed to a limit of 10 minutes. Performers and teachers will be delighted to know that their participation in this festival means that authors will be directly reimbursed because of their works being performed at this festival.
- 23. Solo dramatic items must be announced with title and author at the time of performance to qualify for copyright indemnity, and the performer must not change the words or gender of the character.
- 24. Duologues and group dramatic activity are not covered by this agreement and copyright for these items should be sought by performers at time of entry.
- 25. Performers in Own Choice verse classes will be required to submit a copy to the Adjudicator's Steward stating TITLE AUTHOR PUBLISHER.

CHILD LICENSING

Please note licences are required for Primary Aged Solo and Duologue Acting Classes Only as these will take please on the afternoon of Friday 17th May and may require the entrant to miss a small section of the school day. Please access link below to apply

Please note that both the music and speech and drama festivals classes apart from Primary Aged Acting mentioned above will be held over the weekend so a performers licence will not be required.

If your child is performing as part of a school group, then the school will cover all aspects of child licensing on your behalf.

The festival will apply for the necessary Body of Persons Approval to cover all children performing in the festival.

CHILD PROTECTION POLICY



Northampton Festival of the Performing Arts Child Protection Policy

The British and International Federation of Festivals for Music, Dance and Speech work for amateur festivals everywhere to help create thousands of educational performance opportunities for children and young people each year.

The Federation, and our member festivals, are committed to ensuring safe environments for children and young people and believe that it is always unacceptable for a child or young person to experience abuse of any kind. We recognise our responsibility to safeguard the welfare of all children and young people, by a commitment to recommend best practice which protects them.

This policy applies to our Board of Trustees, paid staff, Adjudicator members, volunteers, students or anyone working on behalf of the Federation and our member festivals.

We recognise that:

- the welfare of the child/young person is paramount
- all children, regardless of age, disability, gender, racial heritage, religious belief, sexual
 orientation or identity, have the right to equal protection from all types of harm or
 abuse.
- working in partnership with children, young people, their parents, carers and other agencies is essential in promoting young people's welfare.

The purpose of the policy:

- to provide protection for the children and young people who participate in our festivals, including the children of festival members.
- to provide staff and volunteers with guidance on procedures they should adopt in the event that they suspect a child or young person may be experiencing, or be at risk of, harm.

We will seek to safeguard children and young people by:

valuing them, listening to and respecting them.

- adopting child protection guidelines through procedures and safe working practice for staff and volunteers.
- recruiting staff and volunteers safely, ensuring all necessary checks are made
- sharing information about child protection and safe working practice with children, parents, staff and volunteers.
- sharing information about concerns with agencies who need to know and involving parents and children appropriately.
- providing effective management for staff and volunteers through supervision, support and training.

We are a self-financing charitable organisation run by a team of dedicated volunteers. We need help financially, to enable the festival - your festival - to maintain a service of the highest quality and to plan future festivals with confidence.

will be used to purchase a voucher to be presented to the winner of a class selected by the Sponsor. These figures are subject to review at the discretion of the Committee. Class Sponsors can select the class for which their award will be made,

subject to that class not already being sponsored. If the chosen class has insufficient entries to justify an award, the committee will decide to whom to award the sponsorship.

Sponsors are encouraged to present their own award where possible, but we ask that they make themselves known to the Adjudicator's Steward before the class commences.

ENDOWMENT FUND

It has become increasingly difficult for the festival committee to administer the present system of trophies and to bear the insurance costs. It is therefore the Committee's aim to develop an Endowment Fund and to encourage future donors to support the festival by contributing to the fund from which awards can be made, existing events encouraged, and new ones sponsored.

Because of this, the Committee has decided not to accept further gifts of any kind of trophy. If anyone wishes to donate, that generosity will be recorded in a list published in the festival programme. This may well be relevant to commemorate someone as a form of memorial. If this is something which appeals to you, please get in touch with the Treasurer or the General Secretary who will be delighted to discuss the possibility with you.
